- The Anglican Church of Southern Africa rises to the challenge of the the Fifth Mark of Mission Last week at the Provincial Synod held in Benoni, the ACSA took several important steps forward in terms of the Fifth Mark of Mission To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth

- Secondly we declared a Climate Emergency. We will be inviting you as a parish to commit to becoming zero waste and getting a certificate to show your commitment.  - complete the Diocesan Indemnity forms and hand over to Churchwardens; and
 - send a list of those young people to the Bishop's office prior to the trip/journey.

Heart of the Flesh presents a very real look at what it means to have a feminist spirituality in a world that glamorizes violence and legitimates domination.
