From the Library: This week our first book is the winner of the 2002 Louisville Grawemeyer award for religion. It is by Miroslav Volf and its title is Exclusion and Embrace: A Theological Exploration of Identity, Otherness and Reconciliation. Life at the beginning of the twenty-first century presents us with a disturbing reality. Otherness, the simple fact of being different in some way, has come to be defined as in and of itself evil. The author contends that if the healing word of the gospel is to be heard today, Christian theology must find ways of speaking, that address the hatred of the other. Reaching back to the New Testament metaphor of salvation as reconciliation. Volf proposes the idea of embrace as a theological response to the problem of exclusion. Increasingly we see that exclusion has become the primary sin, skewing our perceptions of reality and causing us to react out of fear and anger to all those who are not within our (ever-narrowing) circle. In light of this, Christians must learn that salvation comes, not only as we are reconciled to God, and not only as we "learn to live with one another", but as we take the dangerous and costly step of opening ourselves to the other, of enfolding him or her in the same embrace with which we have been enfolded by God. At the time of writing, Miroslav Volf was Professor of Systematic Theology at Yale University Divinity School. Croatian, he writes out of his own first-hand experience of teaching in Croatia during the war in the former Yugoslavia. The well-known theologian Jurgen Moltman, of the University of Tubingen in Germany, wrote of this volume, "This book is a major contribution to political theology today. Born out of the suffering of his people in the Balkans, biblically grounded and future-orientated to a new human community, it is a great witness to the God who forgives and does remember forever, creating a new community out of enemies. There is no better theology of the present-day context of life and death". [241.675 Vol]

I gave our second book to a student who returned it and said that he would love to own it. Thus it is recommended. Wesley Carr has written *Handbook of Pastoral studies*". This book is a comprehensive introduction to the theology and practice of pastoral studies, and offers an authoritative view of the distinctive contribution of Christian pastoral care. It gives those involved in pastoral work an accessible guide to the theological, psychological and sociological concepts which inform both the role of the pastor, and the expectations of those who turn to the Church for help. Students will find it a valuable compendium of information and argument. Experienced ministers will be able to scrutinize their practice with the help of an author who values their work highly. Congregations can use it as a source book. It is structured for reference and dipping into, and there is an extensive bibliography and index. [253 CAR]
