### ST ANDREW'S DAY APPEAL 2020

## DIOCESE OF THE HIGHVELD COVID-19 PROTOCOLS UNDER ALERT LEVEL 3

1. No casual visits will be allowed - no mask, no entry allowed. Only absolutely necessary appointments will be considered (which must be arranged beforehand!) and everyone must be screened and sanitised at the Security Managers station before entering the office building. A record will be kept of the names and contact details of anyone entering the premises. Once screening has been completed, Security will confirm your arrival to your host – please wait for confirmation that your host is ready to receive you before entering the building. If a visitor presents with any symptoms they will not be granted access and will be asked to leave the property

immediately. N.B. No access will be allowed to other areas of the building without prior notice

- 1.1. All deliveries and collections will only be processed at the Security Office and placed in the boxes provided please ensure that you record your delivery in the register.
- 2. **Bishop's meetings** Attendees must report to the Security Office on arrival to be screened before entering the meeting area. No access will be granted if any adverse symptoms are present during the screening process. Everyone must sanitise on entering the meeting venue and record their contact details on the Meeting Register. Attendees are to sit at least one and a half metres apart during the meeting and practice proper social distancing during the taking of any breaks/refreshments that may be provided.

From the Library: Our first book is Godzone : A Traveller's Guide by Michael Riddell. "Godzone is different. As far as I am aware, there are no signs indicating where it starts or stops. I have never seen a sign declaring, 'You are now entering Godzone'. And for a good reason. You never do enter it for that matter ... but even though Godzone is not anywhere in particular, everywhere is in Godzone – if you see!! As Riddell writes, "Godzone is fairly self-explanitory. It is a space inhabited by God. Some people do not believe it exists. Some people do not see the magic in the universe. Some people think they understand life and this book is not for them". He continues, "To those, who have never quite settled in the world, I offer this guide to Godzone. You are already very close to seeing it. The hunger in you is the longing which comes before the dawn. The half-conscious murmurings, the half remembered dreams, the half-forgotten insights are all signposts on the way. Let us journey together. You are now entering Godzone". In the beginning was the road, the long winding road that leads .... where? Godzone is a book of mystery and illumination, a quidebook to the travels of the heart. With humour, story-telling and captivating originality it entices the reader to join its hitchhiking author on the most important journey of all ..... [230.042 RID]

I have reviewed a number of books by Martin Israel. This one is *Smouldering Fire:* The Work of the Holy Spirit. The theme of this book is the problem of good and evil and their reconciliation in Christ. Dr Israel says "At first I had the Holy Spirit in mind as the central focus for my meditation, and indeed the spirit plays a primary role in the book as the agent of human advance to the knowledge of the Godhead. Since so many books on the Holy Spirit had appeared in recent years, most of them directly related to the Charismatic Renewal within the Church. I intended concentrating more on the psychological and psychical aspects of spiritual life, and indeed, these matters occupy a considerable part of the text. As the work proceeded, it was shown to me that something more was required; the charting of the work of the Spirit in man from the birth of spiritual awareness to the ultimate confrontation with evil that brings with it personal death and the rebirth of a new person.
