DIOCESE OF THE HIGHVELD COVID-19 PROTOCOLS UNDER ALERT LEVEL 3

1. No casual visits will be allowed - no mask, no entry allowed. Only absolutely necessary appointments will be considered (which must be arranged beforehand!) and everyone must be screened and sanitised at the Security Managers station before entering the office building. A record will be kept of the names and contact details of anyone entering the premises. Once screening has been completed, Security will confirm your arrival to your host – please wait for confirmation that your host is ready to receive you before entering the building. If a visitor presents with any symptoms they will not be granted access and will be asked to leave the property

immediately. N.B. No access will be allowed to other areas of the building without prior notice

- 1.1. All deliveries and collections will only be processed at the Security Office and placed in the boxes provided please ensure that you record your delivery in the register.
- 2. **Bishop's meetings** Attendees must report to the Security Office on arrival to be screened before entering the meeting area. No access will be granted if any adverse symptoms are present during the screening process. Everyone must sanitise on entering the meeting venue and record their contact details on the Meeting Register. Attendees are to sit at least one and a half metres apart during the meeting and practice proper social distancing during the taking of any breaks/refreshments that may be provided.

From the Library: This week we need to incorporate *The Book of Pastoral Rule* by St Gregory the Great into our theologically trained minds. Recognized as the most thorough pastoral treatise of the patristic era, this sixth-century work, by Pope Gregory, carefully details the duties and obligations of the clergy concerning the spiritual formation of their flock. In Brian Daley's S.J., review of it he writes that this book has served for generations of Christian readers in East and West as a moving, comprehensive description of ministry in the Church. This new translation by George Demacopoulos – the first in English in more than fifty years – is lively and accurate and makes this early Christian classic once again available to us all ... required reading for all pastors. Andrew Louth writes: "Pope Gregory the Great is among the Latin fathers perhaps the closest to the Greek and this book brings out this affinity and shows us Gregory as a true pontifex, that is, 'bridge-builder', between East and West

Our Second book is by Leonard Griffith and is, *We have This Ministry*. Today's church is enmeshed in an identity crisis. The church and its members are constantly turning from fad to fad from theory to theory in their search for the secret of renewal, when the ideal formula for it has been with them all along. The author describes his work thus, "If the Church concentrates less on the rescue operation and more on the persons it ought to be rescuing, then the Church would have the priorities of Jesus, and the people might respond to the Church again, just as they responded to Jesus". This volume challenges each local church, every lay Christian to return to their commitment and to follow the only way to renewal – a genuine obedience to Christ in carrying out his ministry to people everywhere. These two books need to be read in tandem to try to solve this problem of pastoral care. [259 GRI]
